Eleanor and Tilly for their excellent sequence and flow of movement in gymnastics. They performed a great routine where they had focused on choosing shapes that allowed them to transition easily between them, they performed in time and rehearsed well.

Kadi for a fantastic first draft of his newspaper report introduction. Kadi has begun to write in a more formal style, and has worked hard to include key pieces of information about the event - referring to the 5 W's (who?, what?, where?, when? and why?)
