You may remember in December; we had a visit from Reverend Pat Atkinson and Muthukumar from Southern India. Muthukumar came to school for a morning and spoke to the children about his life in India and the children he supports at his local school. Our children made and wrote cards for him to take back to the children, and this week, we have been excited to receive cards back from them. Your child may have brought one of these cards home. You will notice the Indian children have put a lot of effort into beautifully decorating the cards and writing to us in English.


